#### **GREEN URCHIN RANCHING GUIDE**

#### 01 COLLECT URCHINS

- Recommend diving or using minnow traps baited with kelp
- Collect from a barren for ease of collection
- Handle delicately & transport in water
- Keep in running seawater if extended time between collection and cage placement

# PUT URCHINS IN CAGES & PLACE THEM FOR FEEDING

- Minnow traps work well, or anything that can open easily for feeding
- Oyster mariculture cages also work well and may help with biofouling!
- Hang cages off docks, farm lines, or something simillar

### FEED URCHINS

- Kelp is best. This can be harvested from the wild but also collected off farming gear (lines and buoys) or off the beach (wrack)
- Commercial feed works if kelp is unavailable
- Check weekly to ensure they have food amount may vary of time and depending on how many urchins are in a cage
- Don't let them run out of food!


## CHECK URCHIN GONADS FOR HARVESTABILITY

- · Start checking for growth after 6-8 weeks
- Look for changes in size, color, texture, and consistency



- Barren: Areas on the seafloor with a hyper-abundance of urchins and very little seaweeds
- Wrack: Seaweeds washed up on beaches after storms or high tides
- **Biofouling:** Unwanted organisms growing on gear such as traps or lines







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
